# 3. <u>Discussion Panel</u>: Working conditions and labour rights in the waste sector in French-speaking Africa and in the Arab Countries: embedding human and labour rights in urban waste management systems

Waste services feature in many international and national policy commitments, including to prevent, reduce, recycle and reuse – as well as to properly collect and discharge – urban solid waste and halve global food waste by 2030. Although the importance of effective municipal waste services is widely acknowledged, overall, waste workers endure a huge decent work deficit, high levels of precariousness and serious health risks. Many are stuck in poverty wages, cannot afford to live where they work and commute long hours daily. Inclusive national and local waste management plans can set the right framework to ensure that the employment created in waste services is decent and that the working conditions of all workers across the waste service supply chain improve.
