SAFETY & HEALTH CATALOGUE (I)



 The "Occupational Health and Safety Catalog" refers to a online resource that provides guidance and recommendations on occupational health and safety (OHS) issues within the waste collection and waste processing sector. The catalog is developed collaboratively by employers, employees, and sometimes government agencies or industry experts.



• The purpose of an arbocatalogus is to help organizations identify and address potential hazards and risks in the workplace, as well as to promote best practices for ensuring the health and safety of workers. They may cover a wide range of topics, including but not limited to, ergonomics, chemical safety, machinery operation, and emergency procedures.



SAFETY & HEALTH CATALOGUE (II)



 Companies are fully responsible for their own occupational health and safety policies. They must conduct a risk inventory and evaluation (RI&E) and, based on this, develop an action plan. In this plan, they choose the measures to be applied. The Occupational Health and Safety Catalog for the Waste Management Sector serves as a tool for both employers and employees in this process.



SAFETY & HEALTH IN THE COLLECTIVE LABOUR AGREEMENT



- Employers and employees want to work healthily and safely. In addition to
 the legal provisions on working conditions, an Arbocatalogus Afvalbranche
 (occupational health and safety catalogue) applies to our sector. Employers
 and employees in the sector work according to these guidelines. You can find

 provisions of the Arbowet, Arbobesluit and specifically the Arbocatalogus
 Afvalbranche apply to this. When deploying flexible workers within
